# SERMON NOTES



SEPT 10, 2023

You Do Not Always Have Me

John 12:1-11 Dr. Tony Chute, Lead Pastor

**Overview:** As Jesus prepares to enter Jerusalem for His final Passover, He shares a public dinner with Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. As Martha serves the meal and Lazarus reclines at the table, Mary anoints the feet of Jesus with an expensive ointment, thereby filling the house with the fragrance of perfume. Her deep devotion to Jesus is criticized by Judas, who openly states that the ointment should have been sold and the proceeds given to the poor; however, he thinks little of Jesus and wants the money for himself. Jesus does not criticize Mary for her extravagance but commends her, stating that her actions rightly anticipate his death and burial. John notes how people continue to be divided over the claims and actions of Jesus, as many Jews believe in Him while others seek to destroy Him and erase the evidence of His work. Once again, John confronts us with the decision to become public followers of Jesus who devote ourselves to Him while the time remains to do so.

01. Devotion to Jesus is displayed by placing the cross at the center of our relationship to God.

02. Devotion to Jesus is despised by the world but is commended by God.

03. Devotion to Jesus is dedicating ourselves to the things of God while there is time to do so.

# That You May Believe

## QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION & DISCOVERY

- 1. Compare this meal in John 12:1-11 with the wedding at Cana in John 2:1-11. How does the presence of Jesus at the wedding bring joy to the participants and point to the joy Jesus brings through His ministry? How does Jesus's presence at Mary and Martha's home point to the solemnity of His impending death? How does the shift in moods help us to understand the direction Jesus's ministry has taken due to the hardness of people's hearts against Him?
- 2. Note that Lazarus was at the dinner and that people had come to see him (12:2, 9). What would Lazarus's presence suggest about the truth claims of Jesus? What kinds of questions would people have asked Lazarus? What was the intention of the Jewish leaders with regard to having Lazarus put to death (verse 11)? How does their plan to "get rid of the evidence" mirror that of people today who refuse to believe in Jesus despite the evidence of His death and resurrection?
- 3. Mary is often found "at the feet" of Jesus (Luke 10:39; John 11:32; 12:3). What does this suggest about her attitude towards Jesus? Can you think of other people who are noted for falling at the feet of Jesus? (See Matthew 28:9; Mark 7:25; Luke 8:35; 8:41; 17:16, for examples). How can we implement a similar humility without literally falling at Jesus's feet? Do you long to literally fall at the feet of Jesus when you see Him in heaven?
- 4. Compare this account with similar accounts in Matthew 26:6-13, Mark 14:3-9, and Luke 7:36-39. What are the similarities between these accounts? What are the differences? How does each account highlight devotion to Jesus while warning against false devotion?
- 5. What is Judas's stated concern in verse 5? How do verses 4 and 6 inform us not to believe him? How does this insight from John warn us against pretending to be religious? What does this text say about God's knowledge of our hearts, our motives, and our actions?
