



The Return of the King

Psalm 72

Taylor Mendoza, Pastor of Students + Adults

Overview: In a world marked by the struggle for authority and the everpresent yearning for genuine leadership, our hearts ache for a true and righteous ruler. This longing finds its resonance in the ancient words of Psalm 72, where the people cry out for a king whose reign brings justice, peace, and prosperity. As we stand on the precipice of Christmas morning, we're not merely commemorating a historical event but celebrating the birth of a king—the return of the King, whose arrival on that quiet Bethlehem morning echoes through the corridors of Revelation 20-22. Christmas morning is not merely the birth of the King in a manger; it's a profound statement about the nature of authority and leadership.

2. The Good News of the Perfect King (Luke 1:31-33; Mark 1:14-15; Matthew 27:37)

3. The Return of the Perfect King (Revelation 20:11-14; 21:3-5)

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION & DISCOVERY

1. For Christmas morning, try reading through the passages listed in the outline on the other side of this sheet and pick a few of the questions below to discuss for family devotions before opening gifts!

2. How does the vision of the ideal king in Psalm 72 shape your expectations of leadership, and how does the announcement of Jesus as the "Son of the Most High" in Luke 1:32-33 fulfill these expectations?

3. Reflect on the contrast of the humble birth of Jesus on Christmas morning and the proclamation of His kingship through the inscription on the cross in Matthew 27:37. How does this paradox redefine your understanding of true leadership? (Especially in light of His suffering.)

4. How can you live out the humility and sacrificial nature of Christ's leadership in your daily interactions and responsibilities?

5. Consider the prevailing cultural challenges and skepticism toward authority. In what ways does this cultural context influence your perceptions of leadership, and how can you navigate these challenges in light of biblical principles?

6. How can the awareness of the final judgment (see Revelation 20:11-14) inspire a commitment to ethical leadership and responsible stewardship in your spheres of influence?
