

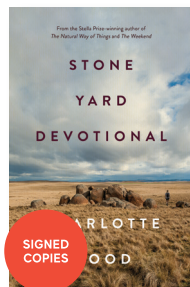

In this compelling novel, a woman abandons her city life to return to the place of her childhood, holing up in a small religious community hidden away in a quiet town. She does not believe in

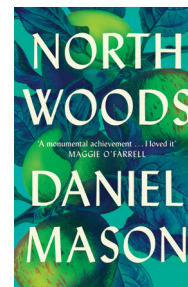

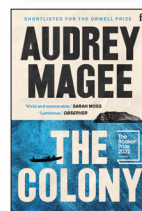
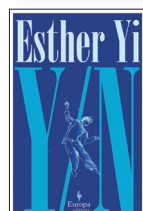
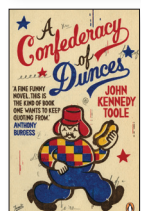
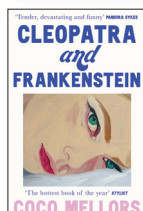
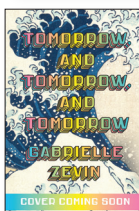
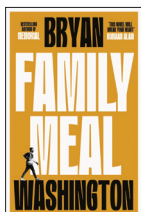
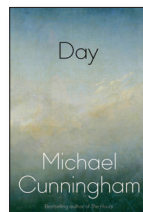
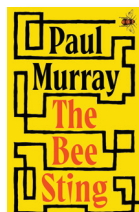


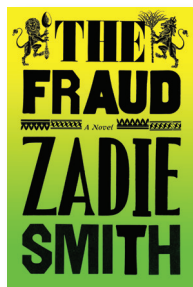
The Turnglass

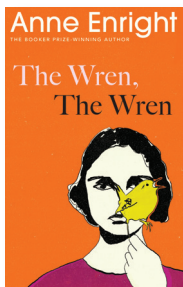




The Fraud
